Anticipation/Reaction Guide - Reading Educator

The Anticipation-Reaction Guide template provides an organizational structure that guides students as they read and analyze the text passage. Teachers can use this guide to: Activate students' background knowledge before reading; Help them identify textual evidence during reading; Help them to evaluate their own and one or more author's perspectives after reading; To prepare the guide, the teacher reviews the curricular materials and identifies key concepts or themes.

The Anticipation/Reaction Guide helps students activate and evaluate prior knowledge. Students make predictions based upon background knowledge and evaluate these predictions after exposure to new information. (H.L. Herber, 1978) Follow these steps to create an Anticipation/Reaction Guide:

Anticipation Reaction Guide An Anticipation/Reaction Guide utilizes a twin strategy to increase reading comprehension: stimulate prior knowledge and experiences before reading and then reinforce key concepts after reading. Anticipation/Reaction Guides encourage students to interact with the author while thinking about issues and ideas. Teachers may use an Anticipation/Reaction Guide to assess class knowledge before they begin a thematic unit or lesson. To develop student analytic reading skills.

Anticipation/Reaction Guide - Appalachian State University

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.

Definition/Description: An anticipation guide is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and get students excited and curious about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to the teacher or another student state key ideas about the concepts in the text.

Reaction Guides - Reading and Writing Strategies

The reaction portion of an anticipation-reaction guide activity requires students to come to final conclusions about what the text actually states as the answer to the questions provided on the anticipation-reaction guide. Students get to ask themselves questions such as, "Did I guess right?" "Was my initial guess confirmed?"
